President's Report

I recently announced to members that our Superintendent, Glen Frewin has decided in the interests of his work/life balance to step down from his role – but remain on staff in a support position, so that we can continue to benefit from his 16 years of knowledge and experience of our course. Glen has overseen many improvements at Axedale and we are indebted to him for his efforts in developing the course to the level that it is now at. Glen's health has, at times, impeded his ability to be as actively involved as he would want to be, but his knowledge of turf and his industry contacts have combined to produce greens that are the envy of many clubs in our district and even further afield – as visiting golfers often provide glowing comment about the presentation of our course. This status was reinforced by a number of the professionals that attended our augural Pro-Am in January.

I am sure all Members have appreciated Glen's dedication to producing the best possible golfing conditions for us over many years – a sincere thank you to Glen from all of us.

Last month, I commented on the role of volunteers in fostering a healthy club. The Australian Sports Commission [2012] published a Healthy Clubs "Checklist" in which it was stated that "healthy clubs have good people doing great things" – this, of course, includes not only paid personnel but also volunteers.

It was also noted that if a club understands its workforce, the number of people and skills required for the various roles, then it is better placed to achieve its desired outcomes.

Simply put, this is all about workforce planning to ensure that the club has - * the

right people * in the right roles * for the right time * with the

right skills, and * at the right cost.

With our Annual General Meeting soon upon us, I again ask: If you think that you may be able to make a contribution to any area of the Club operations, please consider. We often get to the AGM with the General Committee positions firmed up in terms of the required nominations, but this is not the case in the majority of the sub-committees which are just as vital in maintaining a healthy Club. Again, I urge you to consider one of these roles. Forms were emailed to you but are also available at the clubhouse.

The Golfing Pathways project has now reached the final stages – with just a few sections now awaiting asphalting. Compliments have already been received from visiting players – this was particularly the case during our last Natural Hazards Day [June 23] when we had visitors from Rich River, Neangar Park, Bendigo, Kyabram Valley View, Deniliquin and Hepburn Springs amongst the 52-player field. We are planning for an event to note the successful completion of the project and to thank all those involved.

Since the June newsletter, a couple of major competition events have been decided. Geoff Arundell, scored a total of 72 Stableford points to win the Charlie Cugley Cup, whilst Peter Stringer's win over Steven Lee in the final of the Men's Singles Knockout resulted in a memorable acceptance speech by Peter when accepting the David Lubke trophy. The same evening saw many Life Members present when Joe Holland returned to present Garry Harrop with Joe Holland Cup – congratulations to all concerned. We now await the final round of the Peter Nielsen Memorial which is always a special day with Peter's family on hand to present the trophy.

Last month, I made particular note of the need for Members to take care in the wet and soggy conditions and for cart drivers especially to be aware of and avoid the various "no-go" areas on our course. I highly commend to Members the Pitch Marks repair video that was emailed out on June 16.
